

Covid Instructions to Clubs including competitors, coaches and supporting volunteers

Attending Stratford-on-Avon Regatta, 18th September 2021

In accordance with British Rowing Managing Covid-19, Version 14, 20 July 2021

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EVERYONE INCLUDING ATHLETES, OFFICIALS AND SPECTATORS TO ADHERE TO BRITISH ROWING AND GOVERNMENT GUIDELINES WITH REGARDS TO CORONAVIRUS WHEN ON SITE.

Please read and understand these details before attending the event. Thank you.

Club Covid-19 Officer: Each visiting club must appoint a Covid Officer for Test and Trace purposes. It is a condition that to compete each participating club must provide the name, e-mail address and telephone number of their Club Covid Officer. This will be required before or at Registration and BEFORE the crews are registered. They must be available to liaise with the Regatta's Covid Officer during the regatta and for 21 days afterwards. ***Crews will not be registered or allowed to compete if details of their Covid Officer are not provided.***

Contact details & Test and Trace: Competing clubs' Covid Officers are the link for Test and Trace purposes.

Registration & Crew changes: One club representative only please to register crews and declare any crew changes. Please wear a face covering to be worn when doing so. Please ensure that the contact details of any replacement personnel are lodged with your club's Covid-19 officer BEFORE crew changes are made.

Self-sufficiency: Clubs, competitors, coaches and supporting volunteers are asked to:

- Conduct a self-assessed health check before attending the event; anyone with signs of Covid-19 must not attend. If anyone develops symptoms on the day, they and their close contacts must leave immediately and inform both their club's and the Regatta's Covid-19 officer by phone.
- Risk Assess your attendance at the event including trailer management, boat rigging and boat sharing; please be reminded that the Regatta site is a public space.
- Work (boat rigging etc) within their allocated trailer space.
- Present boats to the Safety Check in a compliant condition.
- Ensure there are adequate personnel to assist crews and scullers at Boat Check, Boats On and Boats Off; external support is on offer ONLY in emergency situations.
- Respond to the Marshalls' (who are Covid-19 trained) requests when asked to do so.

The Clubhouse is open only to Regatta Officials and members of Stratford on Avon Boat Club. It is NOT open to visiting clubs and their supporters except those who require to use the **Disabled Toilet Facilities; Public Toilets** are located on the Recreation Ground.

Changing Rooms and Showers will **NOT** be available except in an emergency.

Regatta enclosure: Athletes will disembark at 'Boats Off' which is located within the enclosure; they and their coaches and volunteers will therefore pass through the enclosure. When doing so they are encouraged to socially distance. When engaging with services that are operating in the enclosure, please wear a face covering.
